Springfield Tech dethroned two-time defending champion Quinsigamond, earning the 2nd Annual Lois A. Martin Student Mathematics League Award.

Springfield Tech, which also was the top NEMATYC team in 2009, was the first team to take the No. 1 spot in the Northeast since Massasoit and Middlesex tied in 2007.
